What to report?

Indicate it concerns a situation in the port. Describe as detailed as possible what you know or what you have seen. Report characteristics of people, cars, and vessels.

How to report.

If you see, hear, or experience something unusual during your work, report it. This way, the port remains a place where you can work safely. There are various ways to report something, **including anonymously.**

Within your organization

Or choose to report outside your organisation



1. Discuss it with someone in your organization.

For example, a colleague or supervisor whom you trust.

Can't or don't want to do this?



2. Report confidentially.

If possible, report it confidentially within your organization. For example, to the confidential advisor in your company.



Outside your organization (not anonymously)
